

Congratulations to the Lady Lumley's students who took part in the **North Yorkshire School Games** at Queen Margaret's School on Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> July. In sweltering heat the different groups of students took part in **rounders**, **boccia**, **kurling and modern pentathlon** events, and achieved silver medals in both the boccia and rounders (see last week's newsletter) competitions.

# Scarborough and Ryedale Astronomical Society

Did you know that the light from the Sun took approximately 8 minutes to reach your eyes, and that the surface of the Sun is a cool 5,500°C? To find out more about our nearest star, be sure to come along to Dalby Forest Visitor Centre on Sunday 4th August between 1pm and 4pm and join Scarborough & Ryedale Astronomical Society for some solar observing. Weather permitting, you should be able to see features on the Sun such as flares and sunspots, and a glimpse of the bubbling surface of the Sun through specialist and safe Hydrogen Alpha telescopes. You should NEVER look directly at the Sun without specialist equipment, which is designed to filter out the high energy radiation from the Sun (including UV). See our star in a way you have never seen it before. Our events are free of charge, but we are a registered charity (1092385) and donations are welcome to help maintain our equipment and observatories.
