

Year 12 and 13 French trip to lecture at Alliance Française, York

On Thursday 20th March, 4 of our sixth formers taking French, along with Mrs Robson, Miss Wilson and Mr Heeley went to an evening lecture run by the Alliance Française at St Peter's School, York. The lecture was given by a French-Canadian professor at Grenoble University, France, and dealt with how the French language has had an influence on English over the centuries. This was a really beneficial and interesting opportunity for the students to practise their listening skills and understand more about the wider context of French language and culture.
