Lady Lumley's Educational Foundation

Students of Lady Lumley's School are eligible for grants from Lady Lumley's Educational Foundation. The Foundation welcomes letters which explain why the purchase is necessary and it is also helpful to enclose evidence of the expenditure or proposed expenditure. It is also nice, and very polite, to write to thank the Foundation after a grant has been made and to let the Foundation know how you are doing. The Foundation considers all requests on their individual merits but does not have an unlimited amount of money and is unable to fund some recurring costs, for example tuition fees.

I am studying modern European literature at the University of Brentford and am required to buy a large number of books for the course. I am a student in Year 11 at Lady Lumley's School and have recently taken up the sport of lacrosse in a competitive manner. I have been a member of the Scarborough lacrosse club for the past year and have been attending training sessions every weekend. Having represented the district in competitions over the last six months, I was really pleased to have been asked to represent the county in the under-16 squad. I hope to be able to follow in the footsteps of my older sister who represented the county at senior level. Because I train every weekend, I have not been able to take on a part-time job in order to help my parents for the cost of the training. It has been quite expensive to travel to training each weekend and to buy the equipment necessary for the game. At the moment we spend about £20 per week on petrol travelling to training and have just had to buy a new lacrosse stick and boots at a cost of £200. I would be really grateful for any financial help that the foundation could offer. I have enclosed the training schedule for 2013-14 and receipts for the equipment mentioned above. I am currently working as an apprentice at Smith's garages in Malton. I started last September and I'm now in my second year. I left Lady Lumley's school in the summer of 2012 after my GCSE examinations. I studied vehicle technology in the last two years and really enjoyed that, so that's why I wanted to become a motor mechanic. Most of the tools I used in my first year were provided by the garage, but now I need to start to make up my own tool set. Everybody recommends that I buy high-quality tools that will last me a lifetime and they recommend the Snap-on brand. A basic, beginners kit of tools in the toolbox that move will enable me to start my collection will cost between £300 and £350. I will also need to spend another £30 on safety boots and glasses. I have included information from internet showing the tools I would like to buy and a photocopy from the catalogue about the safety equipment.
