Dear Parents, Carers and Friends

I would like to continue explaining the school's priorities for this year. I have already covered cooperative learning and shared schemes of learning and, this issue, I will talk about marking for impact. Marking is one of the ways feedback is given to students; and feedback (done correctly!) has the biggest single impact upon students' achievements (see the Sutton Trust Toolkit). Teachers put a lot of effort into marking work and it can be considered the equivalent of individual tuition – each set of comments is unique to the student. The impact comes when students react to the comments made and do something differently as a result. This is where the purple pen (“the gamechanger”) comes into play. The teacher marks the student's work in green, and the student responds to the marking in purple. This means all of us – student, teacher and parents/carers – can see the impact of the marking. Most of us will remember our school days when we got marks out of ten or the odd comment about the quality of our work. This sort of marking does not bring about improvement, whereas real progress follows if students act upon suggestions and further questions. Marking for impact is not easy so we are active in sharing examples of good practice. Subject leaders regularly look at the books of the teachers in their areas and the senior leadership team carry out fortnightly book scrutinies of particular subjects or particular groups of students. Please keep an eye on your children's books, as they should give you a good idea of what they are doing in their subjects and what they need to do to improve even further.

We had a fantastically useful training day last Friday. The whole day was focussed on the students in the school and every member of staff who has direct contact with students spent their time discussing the learning needs of each young person from Years 7 to 13. This links in with our emphasis on personalisation and knowing every single student. Richard Bramley
