Lady Lumley's School are Scarborough & District Basketball Champions

Lady Lumley's School retain the SDSSA Basketball Shield for a consecutive year. The Year 9 Basketball team faced Scalby, Ryedale and St. Augustines. The semi-final was played against Scalby and LLS came away with a convincing 26-8 win. Ryedale beat St. Augustines 20-4 in the other semi-final. Ryedale awaited the lads in the final. LLS started the game poorly, going 8-2 down after seven minutes. During the last minute **Will Hutchinson** and **Jack Murray** clawed the points back to 8-6. Ryedale scored immediately after half-time, making the score 10-6. Both teams continued to score until LLS found themselves 11-12 down with only seven seconds left on the clock; **Joe Harland** went up for a lay-up but was fouled in the process; resulting in 1 point and baseline possession to LLS. The score was 12-12 with three seconds to play; unfortunately **Lawrence Blades**, who was underneath the basket, could not convert his last chance. The game finished 12-12, meaning the match had to head to two minutes of overtime. **Dan Tomlinson** scored early in overtime to make the score 14-12. Ryedale were fouled whilst shooting with only seconds to play, taking the score to 14-13 and setting up a tense final few seconds. However, LLS managed to intercept the injection from Ryedale and the final hooter came.

LLS were crowned SDSSA Champions after their fantastic triumph over Ryedale. The first time LLS have retained the shield for two consecutive years.



Yr13 A Level Business Studies trip to Center Parcs and JCB Factory

As an international business, Center Parcs forms the Case Study for the A Level course this year. On Monday 26th Jan, the Yr13 Business Studies students travelled to the Sherwood Forest site to experience it first hand. On the first morning, the students had an extensive guided tour of the whole site, where they learnt how the business operates: from catering to its core target markets through activities, restaurants and shopping facilities, to developing new and upmarket lodge accommodation within an eco-friendly environment. In the afternoon, the students were able to experience the facilities for themselves such as the Sub-Tropical Paradise, crazy mini-golf, sports facilities and catering outlets.

The following day, we left Center Parcs to travel to Rocester near Uttoxeter, where students had a 2 hour VIP tour of the enormous JCB Factory. It was a fantastic opportunity to see first-hand a global British company in action: the tour started with a slick presentation where students were given an overview of the history of JCB. In the museum, they were able to see how JCB products and machines have developed over the years, from the original 'back-hoe' machine of the 1950s to the record-breaking 'Dieselmax' racing car which holds the land speed record for a diesel engine. There then followed a fascinating tour of the factory floor when students saw the production process from the raw steel to a brand new back-loader coming off the production line.

All in all, it was a hugely informative and enjoyable trip.

Latest news on the school's cross country stars

For the third consecutive week, three of our young athletes competed exceptionally well at a cross country championship. Their latest successes were achieved at the Northern Counties Championships, which was held at the Tadcaster Racecourse on a fine but very cold day, over surrounding muddy fields.

In the opening race of the championships, the Under 17 Women's race, **Emma Clapton** had a battle with the winner, Harriet Knowles-Jones who has represented Great Britain this season, and the runner up Kate Waugh who was the reigning champion. Emma added the bronze medal to her North Yorkshire Schools gold and the Yorkshire County silver medals.

Bronwen Owen and **Chistiana Pain** competed in the Women's Under 20 race, in which Bronwen added another gold medal to her Yorkshire County gold, after taking over the lead before the halfway stage, and subsequently remained ahead to secure a notable victory at the championships which she won for the first time in 2011. **Christiana** who won the Senior Girl's North Yorkshire Schools title this season, finished up in 10th place of a top class field.
