## Spanish Exchange to Colmenar Viejo, Madrid

Last week 13 students from Y10, 11 and 12, along with Miss Wilson and Mr Blacklock, took part in our Spanish exchange. Our partner school is I.E.S Angel Corella, in Colmenar Viejo, a small town just north of Madrid, the capital. We were warmly greeted with a welcome reception where we met the host families, some of the teachers at the school and the headteacher. Students had already been paired up with their host partner and spent the week with host families. All our students were made to feel very welcome and were instantly part of the family thanks to the kindness of their Spanish hosts. We were able to spend a day in school, getting to know the students, and taking part in some lessons including art and PE. Another day was spent in Madrid, visiting an art museum, and visiting the impressive Plaza Mayor. Students also visited the ancient medieval city of Toledo, involving a great deal of walking up and down hilly streets. And, speaking of hills, we also spent a half day snowshoe walking in the mountains north of Colmenar Viejo! Not an activity people typically associate with Spain, but gave us a chance to experience the vast range of landscapes and activities that Spain has to offer.

This was a fantastic opportunity for our students to experience life in a Spanish school and family, and we are very lucky to have a connection with a school with such a warm, welcoming staff and caring local community. ### Young Swimmers Shine at the Yorkshire Sprints Championships

Twelve students from Lady Lumley's competed in the Yorkshire Long Course Sprints Swimming Championships, held in Sheffield, at the Ponds Forges International Centre Sports Centre at the weekend. All the swimmers were focused and determined, gaining 23 personal best swims and seven top ten finishes, but it was Year 7 pupil **Jason Robson** who was the star of the event. Earning a place in the finals in all four of his events, he dominated the competition becoming Yorkshire Champion in 50m Butterfly and Freestyle, with a Silver in 50m Backstroke and a Bronze in 50m Breaststroke.

11 year old **Joe Kelly** also swam strongly in his races earning a place in the Finals of the 50m Breaststroke and narrowly missing the medals with a well earned 4th place.

15 year old **Alex Lynn**, having recently moved into the combined 15/16 year old category, also earned himself a place in the Finals in two of his events, finishing 10th in his categories. 13 year old **Jacob Head** just missed a place in the 50m freestyle Finals with a competitive swim that earned him an 11th place finish.

Students **Jade Kendrew** (14), **Evie Wright** (14), **Emily Grayson** (13), **Atlanta Dowkes** (12), **Emily Robson** (11), **Owen Hobkinson** (11), **Sophie Boddy** (11), and **Caitlin Wilson** (11) all swam well to earn themselves personal best times.
