## The New Senior Student Team

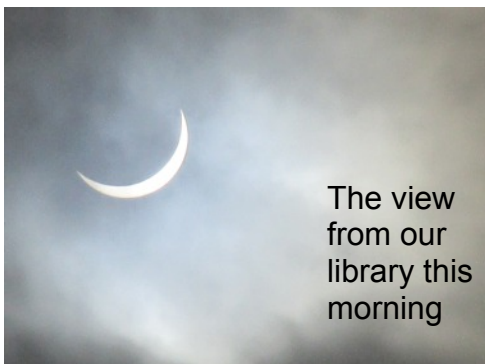

## Parents' Forum

Brian Davis and Richard Bramley met with parents at the meeting on Tuesday evening. A wide range of topics were discussed, including school uniform (no major changes intended), literacy and numeracy across the curriculum and how differentiation in home learning is being delivered. We also discussed the Assessment Policy with a particular focus on how Progress Reports are generated.

## Governor News

Governors met on Thursday evening this week in the first of a new format of meetings. Governors will now meet as the full governing body each meeting, but with a focus on particular areas. Thursday's meeting had an emphasis on the school's resources, particularly money, staff and buildings. Governors discussed the school's budget and how the school compares in its spending to other schools. This benchmarking exercise indicated no significant areas where we differ from the norm, meaning we are probably getting the spending about right. Governors also ratified two updated policies, the school's Behaviour and Assessment policies. The assessment policy has been tweaked in the light of 'life after level's and the expectations underpinning behaviour policy have been made more clear. The new policies will be on the school website by Monday and discussed more fully with staff and students in the new term.

Lady Lumley's students took part in the tenth York Rotary Club National technology tournament at the Railway Museum on Tuesday.
