Dear Parents, Carers and Friends

Lady Lumley's is among an increasing number of schools who are embracing something called the "growth mindset". This is a phrase based on the work of an American psychologist, Carol Dweck who has researched the way people learn for many years. Simply, Doctor Dweck divides the world into those people who believe that human qualities are carved in stone and cannot be changed and those who believe human qualities can be developed. Those people who believe human qualities can be developed are said to have a "growth mindset". Those who believe you are born with innate qualities that you can never change have a "fixed mindset". The growth mindset idea is not a new one. Alfred Binet, the inventor of the IQ test, wrote in 1911 that people's intelligence was not a fixed quantity, but with practice and training we can "become more intelligent than we were before". The comprehensive system is based on the fact that all young people deserve high quality education because all children can succeed.

In her book "Mindset – how you can fulfil your potential" Doctor Dweck poses a set of questions to help you decide if you have a fixed or growth mindset. Read each statement and decide if you mostly agree or mostly disagree with it.

1. Your intelligence is something very basic about you that you can't change very much.
2. You can learn new things, but you can't really change how intelligent you are.
3. No matter how much intelligence you have, you can always change it quite a bit.
4. You can always substantially change how intelligent you are.

If you mainly agree with statements 1 and 2, you have a fixed mindset. If you agreed more with statements 3 and 4, you have a growth mindset. The really cool thing is, even if you currently have a fixed mindset, it can be changed and you can develop a growth mindset instead.

If intelligence was fixed, and people could not change, there would be no point in having schools. At Lady Lumley's we believe that "cleverness" is something that is learnt, not something that you are born with. Everybody can learn and great teaching and the right attitude can make everybody more intelligent than they are now - that's why we are here.

Picasso and 20th Century Spain

On Wednesday 22nd April, we attended a talk in Spanish about the artist Pablo Ruiz Picasso, which was put on by York St. John University. Two native speakers spoke about Picasso's life and work, mainly showing how his landscape paintings were different depending on where he was living at the time, as the colours reflect the architecture of the cities he found himself in (including Málaga, Coruña, Barcelona and Madrid).

Our speakers also spoke a lot about 'Guernica', perhaps Picasso's most famous work, which is his interpretation of the horrific bombing of the civilian population of Guernica during the Spanish Civil War. This was particularly useful, as we study the Civil War as part of our A2 Spanish course here at Lady Lumley's.

Overall, the talk was very informative and helped to improve my Spanish skills, though it was very difficult to listen, as our speakers were talking very fast!

North York Moors Railway Visit

On Tuesday a Year 8 class went down to Pickering station to learn about the restoration of an original Victorian dining carriage. The carriage, which currently is a shell, had been in service from the 1890s to the 1920s, serving customers on the East coast line. Following decommission it was bought by a pig farmer and suffered as a consequence. A group of enthusiastic volunteers are now lovingly restoring the carriage to its former glory, using the evidence available to find out what it used to be like. Lady Lumley's students are going to work with the Railway to create stories and educational resources which can be used for other students to learn about life on the Victorian Railway. The educational team will be coming into school to work with students in their lessons. We will look at newspapers from the archives which document court cases, significant events and the scandals surrounding the railway. We hope to take other classes and have more students involved as the project evolves.
