Governors met last night with a focus on the school's resources, both personnel and financial. The meeting began with a presentation on the role of the advanced teaching support staff in the school by Lorraine Phippen and Debbie Smith. The advanced teaching staff (ATS) team developed as we changed the way we organise non-teaching staff to further support the learning of students in the school.

ATS staff have the opportunity to extend their skillset and use their skills in a wide variety of roles. As examples, the staff cover lessons, support individual students in and out of lessons, support whole classes, run home-learning clubs, act as key workers and train other staff, both in Lady Lumley's and other schools. The ATS team has been a major success and this is due the dedication and quality of the staff associated with the team. There is no doubt that that this new, more flexible and responsive way of working has made a significant difference to the lives of students at Lady Lumley's.

Governors also discussed the school's projected budget for the next five years as, like all schools, we have been affected by a reduction in funding and unavoidable increases in expenditure. Governors have supported the school leadership in making some very difficult decisions this year and the school is now in a secure financial situation for the foreseeable future. Governors commended the exemplary level of professionalism shown by staff during this time.
