## National Road Safety Week Launch with Lady Lumley's 6<sup>th</sup> Form

On Monday 8<sup>th</sup> June, Lady Lumley's 6<sup>th</sup> Form hosted the National CFOA Road Safety Week launch. The aim of the Road Safety Week is for Fire and Rescue services across the UK to come together to raise awareness of the dangers to young drivers of driving whilst distracted. Organiser Mark Naylor (Road Safety Lead for North Yorkshire Fire & Rescue Service) said: "Unfortunately, what we call the fatal four, ie speed, seat belt, drink and mobile phones play a large part in the contributory factors leading to a collision". Year 12 students were able to participate in a number of demonstrations and interactive sessions designed to inform them about the dangers for young drivers. ## Year 12 Chemistry Master Class - University of York

Bright eyed and bushy tailed, the year 12 chemistry class assembled early on Wednesday morning to head off to the University of York outreach centre to participate in a Medicinal Chemistry Masterclass. Accompanied by Mr Bramley and Miss Laverick we donned our Lab coats, rubber gloves and safety goggles, unlike the ones at school we could actually see out of these goggles! We were briefed and set to work extracting some limonene (1-Methyl-4-(1-methylethenyl)-cyclohexene) from orange peel, through an extensive process of grating and distillation we were left with our limonene. This is such a broadly used chemical, that can be found in everything from Mr Muscle to Lynx body spray. One of the main aims of our visit was to get to use some specialist equipment that we don't have access to in our labs at school, such as the Infra-Red spectrometer, a fancy machine that essentially tells you what's in something, in a roundabout way. This for us was such a worthwhile visit to gain an insight into how chemistry at universities works, so huge thanks to Miss Laverick and Mr Bramley for organising this visit and getting us there.
