## ALL PARENTS AND CARERS SHOULD READ THIS

Nearly every student at Lady Lumley's has a mobile phone and access to the internet. This is a fact of modern life and these technologies can be very useful, but they can also be very dangerous. There is a great deal of evidence that young people are behaving in cyber-space in ways that parents and carers do not know about and would be deeply worried if they did. Parents and carers need to understand what their children could be doing.

There are useful sources of information for parents and carers, for instance the "ThinkUKnow" site run by the government's Child Exploitation and Online Protection (CEOP) centre. The link is <https://www.thinkuknow.co.uk/parents/> or just type thinkuknow into a search engine.

These dangers exist for **every** child, and **no-one** with a child in their family is immune. We now live in a different age and all of us, as adults, have a responsibility to be aware of the issues facing the young people in our care.

You may already have seen the campaign launched this week by the National Crime Agency in the national media concerning the increase of sexting amongst young people.

The advice for parents is to understand it, to talk about it and to get your child to tell you about any problems. This is not something any parent or carer can ignore.

A brief overview from the top tips from the CEOP thinkuknow site is given below.

- Be involved in your child's online life. Talk to them about what they're doing, if they know you understand they are more likely to approach you if they need support. Tips on how to discuss tricky issues with your child
- Watch Thinkuknow films to learn more. They can be a good tool for you to find out more about what young people do online and some of the potential risks.
- Keep up-to-date with your child's development online. Be inquisitive and interested in the new gadgets and sites that your child is using.
- Set boundaries in the online world just as you would in the real world. Think about what they might see, what they share, who they talk to and how long they spend online.
- Know what connects to the internet and how. Your child will use all sorts of devices and gadgets; make sure you're aware of which ones can connect to the internet.
- Consider the use of parental controls on devices that link to the internet, such as the TV, laptops, computers, games consoles and mobile phones.
- Emphasise that not everyone is who they say they are. Make sure your child knows never to meet up with someone they only know online.
- Know what to do if something goes wrong. It is important to know when and how to report any problem.

## Young swimmers take on the fastest in the North East

Three Year 7 students from Lady Lumley's School qualified for the North Eastern Region Long Course Swimming Championships, held at Ponds Forge International Sports Centre in Sheffield, at the beginning of June.

**Jason Robson** and **Emily Robson**, who train with York City Baths and **Joe Kelly**, who trains with Scarborough Swimming Club, qualified for an impressive 24 events between them, with Jason winning Gold Medals and earning the title of North East Champion in Eight of his events, with a Bronze for his 50m Free. Emily and Joe both swam strongly, earning personal best times in all their events, Joe making the finals for 4 events.



The standard of competition was extremely high and very serious. Recent rule changes to competitive swimming now means that qualification to National level competitions is via the 24 top fastest, 12/13 year olds in the English rankings, across a six week window of competitions; a challenge which all three young swimmers have their sights set on.

Last year we applied for a grant to Sport England to refurbish our Skate Park in Thornton Le Dale. A couple of weeks ago we received a letter to advise that unfortunately we have not been successful with the application.

On a more positive note, we have secured some funding from Ryedale District Council's Community Award (£1,500), and from the Police and Crime Commissioner to buy a piece of equipment (£4,500). Therefore, we are going to do 3 things following your feedback on the questionnaire to improve the Skate Park:

1. Replace or add a piece of equipment
2. Repair the surfacing
3. Change the layout to improve the flow for wheeled sports
