I said last week that there has been a really positive start to the term and that feeling has continued this week. This feeling has been echoed by recent visitors to school. Yesterday, Dr Paula Mountford who is in charge of the initial teacher training programme at the University of York, came to see me at the school. We have a very good relationship with the University and have benefitted from the excellent training they provide, with a number of teachers at Lady Lumley's having been post-graduate students at York. Paula has known the school for a considerable time, but has not had the grand tour for some years. She was really impressed by the fabric of the school, the developments we have made and, of course, by the wonderful students she met in lessons. As part of her role in teacher training, Paula visits many schools and so her warm and complimentary views on Lady Lumley's are based on a great deal of experience. We are intending, as in previous years, to offer training places to PGCE students in the Autumn and Spring terms as part of our commitment to developing new teachers and continuing to strengthen the teaching workforce.

Another nice thing yesterday was a phone call from Chris Speedy, a driver with Fletchers coaches. The coach Chris was driving on Thursday morning had been used late on Wednesday evening to collect a party of Norwegian students on a school trip. In the dark, one of the young Norwegians left an expensive mobile phone on the bus. In the morning, one of our students, **Hannah Ellam** found the phone and immediately handed it to Mr Speedy, the driver. Mr Speedy called the school yesterday afternoon to tell me the story and to praise the honest and sensible behaviour shown by Hannah, which reflects really well on her and her fellow students.
