Governor News

On Thursday evening we had a full governors' meeting with a focus on resources. The meeting began with a presentation by Brian Davis, assistant Headteacher, on staff development and how this is linked in to the school's priorities as expressed in the 'hexagon' which I have shared with you previously. The meeting then continued with the discussion around the school's five year budget forecast and benchmarking information, where we compare ourselves with other similar schools. In terms of the budget, we have always been cautious when dealing with the school's finances and this means we are now in a secure position for the foreseeable financial future. The benchmarking information compared Lady Lumley's spending with seven other (relatively) similar schools in North Yorkshire. In nearly all of the criteria we came out about average (this is a good thing) with Lady Lumley's having smaller class sizes than most of the other schools. Richard Bramley

Simplifying Login - Soon you'll need to use an **email address as your username**.

Zimbabwe, a land locked country in southern Africa is rich in natural resources, has an abundance of wildlife and spectacular geographical features. Victoria Falls, one of the world's largest waterfalls, is located in the country's northwest as part of the Zambezi river.

Zimbabwe produces much of its power from hydroelectricity generated from Kariba Dam. Despite these national assets much of the population struggles for a living.

Macheke is a small town an hour and a half south east of the capital Harare. Each year I visit the primary school in Macheke where my daughter and I help in the classroom. In the afternoon I teach some older children maths. The children living in the surrounding villages walk several kilometres to school as there is no public transport. We try and take as many shoes as possible as a lot of the children do not have any footwear to go to school in. There are 1400 pupils in Macheke primary and of them over 250 are orphans. Many children do not attend school as fees have to be paid and some families simply cannot afford it.

Class sizes are big with 50 children in each class. As they do not have enough classrooms the classes rotate using the classroom for half the time and when it is being used by another class they have their lessons outside. In July, when we visit, it is surprisingly cold as Macheke is at a high altitude and it is winter in Zimbabwe so having classes outside is not always pleasant. The native language of this part of Zimbabwe is Shona but the children study in English.
