Staff member on journey to become a published author



Dates are now confirmed for the **Lady Lumley's Christmas production of 'Romeo and Juliet'**. Upper school students have been working hard in rehearsals on our special, Cuban themed adaptation. EYMS Scarborough – Pickering 128 Service EYMS, after speaking to the Highways Engineer responsible for the planned Crossgates/Seamer roadworks advise that these will now have the following effect on the 128 Pickering to Scarborough service: **Section 1 (23 – 27 November)** between approximately 0730 and 1600 temporary traffic signals will be installed on the section of the B1261 between Centurion Way at Crossgates and the mini roundabout at the junction of the B1261, Stoney Hags Road and Pasture Lane. No diversions will be necessary, but the bus stops nearest to the B1261/Stoney Hags/Pasture Lane mini roundabout will be suspended. Students normally boarding here will need to catch the bus at the next stop . **Section 1 (30 November – 4 December)** between approximately 0730 and 1600 the B1261 will be closed between Centurion Way at Crossgates and the mini roundabout at the junction of the B1261, Stoney Hags Road and Pasture Lane. The 128 will follow the usual route to the roundabout on the B1261 adjacent to the Byways pub where it will turn left onto Cayton Low Road, then right onto Dunslow Road, left onto the A64 Seamer Bypass and right at the next roundabout on the A64 in order to access Seamer village. It will then resume its usual route at Seamer roundabout. Students from Crossgates and Seamer will need to use the stops at The Byways or Main Street, Seamer. **Section 2: (Possibly taking place from 7 December but yet to be confirmed)**. This section involves the resurfacing of the B1261 between The Byways and Musham Bank roundabouts. The 128 will operate via the normal route to Musham Bank roundabout on the A64 and then turn left onto Musham Bank Road to Manham Hill and then right onto Cayton Low Road in order to resume the usual route at Crossgates. Students who normally catch the 128 between Musham Bank and The Byways roundabouts will need to use alternative bus stops.
