This was only one of the events that students organised during the week and it is a great credit to the young people in the school that they have such a caring attitude towards others less fortunate than themselves. Also this week the interviews for the position of head boy, head girl and their deputies were held. Every other Friday morning we have a short session in the morning where we share ideas about teaching and learning. Although this has been a short half-term, since February we have had sessions on meta-cognition, literacy, numeracy, stretch and challenge and making leaning stick. Brian Davis organises these sessions and other staff contribute in their particular areas of interest and expertise. Last week, Mr Davis reminded us of the day's training we had with the internationally recognised educationalist Mike Hughes a few years ago. A key question he asked us, and one we continually ask ourselves, is "What do you ask students to do to/with information in order to make it more likely that they will understand it?". We know that learning is an active process and learning only happens as a consequence of thinking, so our job is to make young people think. This may sound easy (it's not!), but it really is the art and craft of teaching and underpins everything we try to do in the school.

Mental Health Production - 15th March 2016

On Tuesday, Lady Lumley's School hosted a mental health production and workshop for all year 10 students. The main focus of the Theatre in Education was on emotional and mental health wellbeing, which was delivered by the York based production company, An Invisible Man. The play, 'Inside Out', which was watched by all year 10 students, is an examination of the personal, social and emotional landscape for many modern teenagers. The play focused on how the actions, influences and pressures in our lives can open us to deterioration in our mental and emotional health. The workshop then provided a platform to discuss positive steps which may be employed to improve how we are feeling about ourselves and the world around us; as well as remove the stigma surrounding mental health. Feedback from the students has been extremely positive, with one student saying that the play was particularly interesting "because it created awareness of mental health and was age appropriate." We hope to organise more Theatre in Education productions, for all year groups, in the near future.
