Dear Parents, Carers and Friends

I was going to start this Newsletter with "there is a Chinese curse '*may you live in interesting times*'". I have now carried out a little research (Google and Wikipedia) and discovered that the phrase, whilst known as the Chinese Curse is apocryphal (i.e. of doubtful authenticity). Nevertheless, the idea remains the same and "interesting times" can be very difficult to live through.

I wrote in last week's Newsletter about the Government's plans to force all schools to become academies by 2022. I did say this was a rapidly changing situation and within a few hours of printing, the news came through of a "Government U-turn on English schools to Academies plan". Of course, when reading the small print, things turn out not to be as simple as they could appear. In most people's opinion, the Government's intention, that all schools will become academies, has not changed. It is also inevitable that the role of the local authority will also change. How long Lady Lumley's can remain a local authority school is simply not known. The meeting of the primary and secondary schools in the Ryedale area still took place last night and was very well attended by headteachers and school governors. There were also senior staff from the local authority, including the assistant director for education and skills, Jill Hodges. There was much discussion about the future of education locally and attendees were able to share their current views and intentions. At the moment, with so much unknown and such a changeable situation, most of us attending just wanted some certainty about how the Government's intentions will affect our schools and our neighbouring schools. The good news is that the focus of the meeting last night was on the children and how any changes would affect the young people in our schools. Whatever the future educational landscape may be, the children come first. All of the schools recognise this and all of the schools will continue to work together to help their students do as well as possible. These are "interesting times", but as long as we keep the students at the centre of everything we do, we will all get through this and come out stronger on the other side.

Meanwhile, back at the normal life of the school, the main block of formal examinations begin next week. I would like to wish all the best to the students in Years 11, 12 and 13 taking these important examinations and I know that their hard work and commitment will pay dividends.

**Word of the Week - Autonomy**

There are many common words that begin with "auto" and they derive from the same root: e.g. *autobiography: an account of a person's life written by that person (yourself); automobile: a way of making yourself mobile; autograph: your signature, from self and written; automatic: a machine that works by itself.*
