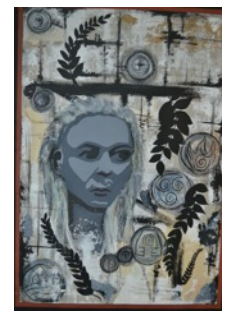
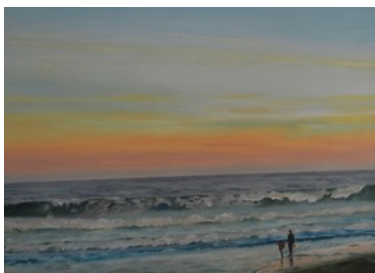

Holidays in term-time

The Local Authority has sent out guidance to schools following the recent High Court ruling in May. The Department for Education has stated that a student who attends school less than 90% is classed as "persistently absent". This is because they are missing 1 day in 10 and also missing out on a lot of education. Persistent absence is a special category at the extreme of expected absence; a school would be in trouble with Ofsted if its students were absent more than 5%. Each day in school is new, and each day builds on the day before. When a student misses a lesson, it makes it harder to understand the next lesson and obviously affects the young person's learning. The High Court bizarrely decided that 90% attendance was acceptable in the Isle of Wight case and so, until there is an appeal or a change in the law, the Local Authority has issued new guidance. The school has been advised to follow the 2014 DfE guidance and ask the Local Authority to issue a penalty notice where there has been a holiday in term time without exceptional circumstances. The school will also send details of the student's attendance and the Local Authority will then make the decision whether to prosecute or not. I really hope there will be sensible resolution soon as the current situation can cause unnecessary tension between schools and home. Whatever the outcome, I hope parents and carers think really carefully about the impact of taking their children out of school in term time as missing school will have a negative impact on their child. Swimming Success

Congratulations to Year 8 swimmers **Emily Robson** and **Joe Kelly** who qualified to compete at this year's Long Course Age Groups, North East of England Swimming Championships, held over two weekends at the Ponds Forge International Centre in Sheffield during May. After four days of tough competition, against the best swimmers in the region, Emily Robson, swam in five events, 200m Individual Medley, 200m Breast, 100m Butterfly, 100m Breast and 50m Breast. She earned herself two finals finishing 10th in her 100m Breast and in a very competitive finals for 50m Breast she earned a silver medal, narrowly missing a qualification time for this year's British Nationals.

Joe Kelly, also competed in five events earning himself places in 3 finals. He finished 100m Breast in 10th place, 400m Individual Medley in 12th, 50m Breast in 8th, 400m Free in 13th and 200m Breast in 9th place. Great results from both swimmers in personal best times and with their long term training programs, Emily at York City Baths Club and Joe at Scarborough Swimming Club, they are both hopeful of qualifying places at the British Nationals in the near future.
