Word of the Week - Consequence. This is a great word to take apart to work out what it means. *Sequence* we should know from maths is **things following each other**, e.g. 2,4,6,8 or Monday, Tuesday etc. *Con-* means **with**. It comes from the Latin *com-* which changes to *con-* when the next bit of word begins with s. So consequence means the **result or effect of some previous occurrence**. Example: "as a consequence of the referendum result, the value of the pound fell". In mathematics, a consequence is a **conclusion reached by reasoning**.
