### YOLO - Risky Behaviour

A theatre company visited Lady Lumley's School on Tuesday 15th November to perform a series of workshops with Year 9 students on the risks of drugs, alcohol and sexual intercourse. To start off the morning, a couple of actors performed an hour long play, showing four different characters and two different stories that revealed potential risks for teenagers. Some of the risks they warned us of were getting into trouble, being physically harmed or injured, illness, public harassment, a criminal record, a heart attack and falling pregnant. The play featured a 15 year old girl and a 16 year old boy, the risks they took and the situations they got themselves into. In the second half there was a workshop where we played games, asked questions and learnt key facts. We were taught about how drugs mess with our minds and how to keep ourselves safe from becoming pregnant and catching diseases. This was, overall, a very educating experience and should be shared with other schools.
