Dear Parents, Carers and Friends

The staff and students who went on the ski trip to Austria returned late on Monday night/ early on Tuesday morning after a very successful trip, albeit with a protracted return journey. Teachers and students I have spoken to said they had a fabulous time and I was also told that staff at the resort and hotels were incredibly complementary about our students. I would just like to mention one of the students who had missed my Chemistry lesson during the ski trip. Despite not getting back until the early hours of Tuesday, she had downloaded the work for the lesson from Fronter and completed it before I saw her in Wednesday's lesson. I thought this was a good use of new technologies and deserved a mention as an impressive example of get-up-and-go.

On Tuesday we held the Year 10 consultation evening. There was a very good turn-out of parents, carers and students and there was a really positive atmosphere in the hall. Year 10 are mainly following new GCSE courses which have definitely ramped up the content compared to previous courses (Year 11 are already doing these new courses in maths and English). While these courses are quite challenging, the more reassuring news is that they are equally challenging to every Year 10 and 11 student in the country. Whilst eventual outcomes are largely determined by how much effort students put in, at Lady Lumley's school the students are supported by excellent staff and high quality teaching so that their effort can reap a just reward.

Ski Trip 2017 – Wagrain

On New Year's Day, 31 students and 4 staff departed for the annual school ski trip, with Wagrain, Austria the destination on this occasion.

After arriving at midnight all the group woke up the following morning in anticipation for what the slopes looked like. Sadly the first day we were told 80% of the snow was artificial but we were promised that snow was on the way. The forecast proved correct and for the remainder of the trip the students were able to develop their knowledge of skiing by having the most perfect experience of Alpine skiing imaginable. Over the course of the week well over a metre of fresh powder dumped down on us, making conditions challenging but perfect.

Evening activities included swimming in an outdoor thermal pool with snow falling, use of the indoor sportshall, quiz night based on Mr Walton's eclectic music taste, bus trip into the town centre, and concluding with a pizza night at a local pizzeria.

Our students were commended by both the ski instructors ("one of the best and most positive groups we've had") and hotel staff ("the cleanest UK group to use the hotel").

House Bake Off Round 1 - Tuesday 17th January

Bake Off Round 1 begins on Tuesday 17th - students must bake a meringue creation at home (this could be one large creation or 6 mini's- no nuts allowed please!!). Students will present their creation to the judges at 12:40pm on Tuesday in FT2. All bakes should be submitted by 8:55am to FT2 on Tuesday with a name label.

Round 2a and 2b will take place on the following two Tuesdays where students will be asked to bake 12 identical pastries of their choice over 90 minute period. The judges will award points for creativity, taste, presentation and uniformity. The top 4 from each house will then go through to the show stopper on Tuesday 7th February where they will make a 3-D biscuit creation alongside staff teams.

Word of the Week

Well 'phrase of the week'. **Portmanteau Word.** This phrase was first used by Lewis Carroll (author of Alice in Wonderland – one of my favourite books). A portmanteau word is "two meanings packed up into one word". Lewis Carroll used many portmanteau words in his poem Jabberwocky (which is also one of my favourite poems) e.g. mimsy from flimsy and miserable. Modern speech uses lots of portmanteau words e.g. Brexit (Britain and Exit), brunch (breakfast and lunch), Bollywood (Bombay and Hollywood), Brangelina (Brad and Angelina), docudrama (documentary and drama), sexting (sex and texting), phablet (phone and tablet), digimon (digital monsters). Interestingly, portmanteau is itself a portmanteau word, from porter (to carry) and manteau (a cloak).
