The Maths Challenge involves answering 25 multiple choice questions in one hour, but some points are deducted for incorrect answers!



Qualifying for the Spring Yorkshire Championships in Leeds , Joe and Simon had 3 events each and found themselves competing in the 200m Freestyle event with Olympic swimmer Max Litchfield! #### Word of the Week - Context

I decided on *context* about 3 weeks ago but it got displaced by paraphernalia, suffix and prefix. Paraphernalia was used in the context of the school's drugs policy and suffix and prefix in the context of a mistake I had made in a previous Word of the Week. *Context* means 'setting the scene' so that the other words make sense. Sometimes the *context* is other words, sometimes it is the place we are in. For instance, the word formula in the context of maths lesson means something different from the word formula in a chemistry lesson. In examinations, there is often a paragraph or two setting the context of the question. These paragraphs are sometimes ignored by students but they must be read to make sense of the rest of the question.
