I have had a dramatic week this week. Year 9 students – “the Green Parrot Theatre” – went to Pickering Junior School on Wednesday this week as part of their grand tour of local partner primary schools. It was a lovely performance devised by the students themselves about life at ‘big’ school for an audience of Year 6 pupils. There was also an opportunity for the young people in Year 6 to ask the Year 9 students any burning questions about life at Lady Lumley’s compared to that of their familiar junior school. And at assemblies this week I had the great pleasure of watching a “layered mime” (another new phrase I have learnt this week) expertly delivered by a group of Year 7 and 8 students. I have now seen it twice and am going back this lunchtime to see it again. I haven’t asked Mrs Goodwill yet, but it would be great if this was reprised in the summer and more parents and carers could get to see it. This morning (Friday) all teaching staff had a demonstration of the AED (automated external defibrillator) which will be placed in the link corridor after Easter. There is a staff training day on Monday 24<sup>th</sup> April and we will welcome the students back into school on Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup>. As it is the summer term, green jumpers are now optional until half-term in October. For those students revising for the examinations try to remember all the advice given during this year – basically little and often and quiz yourself. There will be revision sessions in school over the Easter break and your son or daughter will already be aware of these. I hope everyone has a nice Easter break.

### Team Maths Challenge

#### Last week's problem to solve...

In the Mathstown greengrocers shop:

- 9 apples cost the same as 6 bananas
- 4 bananas cost the same as 3 coconuts

At these same prices, how many apples cost the same as 8 coconuts? Solution in next week's newsletter!

#### Solution to the problem:

If 4 bananas cost the same as 3 coconuts, then 6 bananas cost the same as 4.5 coconuts. Therefore 9 apples cost the same as 4.5 coconuts. So you can get 2 apples for the price of one coconut.

Therefore, 8 coconuts cost the same as 16 apples.

**Word of the Week - Swash.** I met (or re-met) this word in a Year 7 geography lesson. I was really impressed by the class, their eagerness to learn and engage in the lesson and the great ideas they had. We discussed filtering sea water to make pure water which I explained was a great idea but extremely difficult and even unfeasible. The very next morning there was a report for the University of Manchester where they have, in principle at least, designed a way of doing this! We also discussed how beaches are formed, and one young man suggested that they were made in a similar fashion to the way worms make soil. I thought this was pure genius in terms of making connections and extrapolations but unfortunately erroneous. I was corrected on relating this conversation at home, as the lovely looking white sandy beaches in the Maldives (and other places) are 85% parrot fish poo. I did report back to the class on my newfound knowledge at the earliest opportunity. Meanwhile, swash. In the sense we were using it in the lesson "the dashing movement or sound of water, such as that of waves on a beach". After my lack of knowledge of water filtration and parrot fish, I would recommend checking the actual definition needed for the subject with your geography teacher!
