Year 10 Group say 'Hola' to Raise Money for a Great Cause


On Thursday afternoon the Year 10 CoPE class hosted a Spanish themed coffee afternoon on the Learning Support Department to raise money for

Lady Lumley's North Yorkshire Cricket Champions

Having won the North Yorkshire Under 14 Cricket Trophy a year late due to bad weather conditions at the end of summer 2016, Lady Lumley's School went one stage further and won the North Yorkshire Under 15 Trophy, that included private schools as well as those from the public sector. After wins against Drifffield, Pindar and Huntcliff School from Saltburn, Lady Lumley's won a last ball thriller against St. Peter's from York. A magnificent 67 not out by **Max Harland** swung the game Lumley's way after St. Peter's were confined to 118 after their twenty overs. Lady Lumley's then went on to lose against Birkdale School from Sheffield in the Yorkshire semi-final playoff. Captain Luke Smith said of his team "I have been very proud of the team's performance this year and everyone has chipped in to make it a real squad effort over the course of the season. I have been told it is the furthest Lumley's have been in this competition for the last twenty five years, so that feels like a real achievement".



Year 12 Psychology Trip – University of York

On Wednesday we travelled down to York University to participate in a sixth form conference. During our visit we had the opportunity to participate in psychological research, where we wore special goggles that shifted our vision by 30 degrees to investigate how our brain processes visual information. We also had the experience of looking at the illusion of colour and how virtual reality can be used in psychological research.

We had 3 mini lectures on various psychological topics: the effects of autism on sleep; the effects of social cues within a virtual reality; and the brain differences of football supporters.

This gave us a good insight into what it is like to be an undergraduate in psychology.

Overall we enjoyed the day and we can apply this knowledge to our A level studies. We were also very encouraged by the enthusiastic team of students helping out on the day. It was also nice to be mixed with other schools who had also presented us with posters on psychological research they have carried out.

Food and Beverage Dragon's Den Challenge


All students who took part will receive house points for participation in the event as well as placing points.
