Year 9 Careers in Languages Day

Yesterday 14 students took part in a trip to York St John's University. The day consisted of a series of workshops, and an inspirational talk about where languages can take you. The first workshop was marketing, during which we had to decide how to market Wensleydale cheese to different countries. Next we had an interpreting session where we had to re-tell stories in English and French, as listening for detail is a key skill in interpreting. The third session was a Japanese session where we learnt some basic Japanese phrases, how to write our names in Katakana script, and about Japanese culture (in particular about how important bowing is in Japanese to show respect!). Our final session was about British Sign Language and was taught to us by a deaf man and his interpreter - we learnt how to ask someone's name and sign our own. Thank you to Mr Heeley and Miss Nalin for taking us on the trip, and to Mr Burns for driving the bus. All of us thoroughly enjoyed the experience and now feel even more positive about languages! Word of the Week – Part 1

Superfluous: This word came up in a meeting with Student Voice a few weeks ago and it reminded me that it used to be one of my favourite words when I was a teenager. It can be quite fun to try to learn a new word every so often (once a week or even once day) and then incorporate that word into as many of your conversations as possible until it becomes a natural part of your vocabulary. Superfluous has the prefix *super* and that already tells us something about the word. *Super* means *over, above and beyond*. Think of Superman, a man with powers beyond that of normal people; or *superscript, like °C of cm³* which means writing above the other writing. *Fluous* is a bit trickier, but what words does it sound like? Think about this and then read Word of the Week – Part 2.

Word of the Week – Part 2

Fluous: may have made you think of fluid, which means something that can flow. Superfluous comes from “over (super) and flow (fluous)”. If something is overflowing, we have too much of it. Superfluous means having too much, so it is unnecessary. If you were setting out the cutlery for dinner and there was no soup, then soup spoons would be superfluous.

Since $2017 = 8 \times 252 + 1$, the 2017th letter in the sequence is the first of the repeating sequence, and hence is K.
