

## Word Of The Week - Anaphora

I should have known this and all the English teachers will be pulling their hair out that I did not know it already, but I met it again during interviews on Monday. Anaphora is a rhetorical device where the author repeats a word or phrase at the beginning of successive clauses. The origin of the word is from Greek and Latin words meaning repetition. When I talk to staff at the start of each year about the importance of uniform I use anaphora (without realising it had a posh word to describe it!). "Every student, every member of staff, every time". Each clause starts with the word 'every' and the use of anaphora reinforces the message I am trying to send. Winston Churchill did it better (unsurprisingly) in his speech: "We shall go on to the end. We shall fight in France, we shall fight on the seas and oceans, we shall fight with growing confidence and growing strength in the air, we shall defend our island, whatever the cost may be. We shall fight on the beaches, we shall fight on the landing grounds, we shall fight in the fields and in the streets, we shall fight in the hills; we shall never surrender". An incredibly powerful rallying cry to the nation during very dark times and a great example of anaphora.
