**Home to School Transport**

From 8th January to 2nd April 2018, NYCC consulted on some potential changes to the NYCC school transport.

policy. The new policy was approved by the council on 16 May 2018 with changes being implemented from September 2018.

However, councillors have requested a further short consultation to clarify one aspect of the new policy - the introduction of a voluntary enhanced parental transport allowance for certain families whose school aged children with an education health and care plan would be eligible for, and require, additional transport assistance. **128 Service – Scarborough/Pickering** As you are aware, in addition to the 128 Service bus, East Yorkshire Motor Services provide two further buses to specifically transport students from the Scarborough area. The 'Village Duplicate' collects students living in West and East Ayton and other villages on route to school and the 'Town Duplicate', picks up students boarding between Scarborough Town Centre and Irton.

From September, due to the high number of students who will be travelling from the immediate Scarborough area, the 'Town Duplicate' will fill up quickly. As a result, some students living in Crossgates and all those living in Seamer and Irton will likely have to make use of the normal 128 Service bus. At the end of the school day travel on the 'Town Duplicate' will be prioritised with boarding preference being given to those students having furthest to travel.
