Assemblies this week were devoted to raising awareness of the national Anti-Bullying week campaign which runs from 12th - 16th November. Mr Park and Mr Cleary delivered these assemblies and also emphasised that this view on anti-bullying is not just for a week but for every single day. Word Of The Week - Dissent. Possibly inspired by the current political climate, but also a word many of us (parents, carers, school staff) know from working with children who will sometime question the decisions made by their elders. Dissent means to have a disagreement or have a different opinion. It is often heard in commentary on football matches, where arguing with the referee, or dissent, is a bookable offence. Law 12 in the FA Rules states: "A player is cautioned and shown the yellow card if he commits an offence of dissent by word or action". It is not an easy word to break down into parts. It comes from the Latin word meaning to disagree and, in a similar way to the word disagree basically means *not agree* (the *dis-* part meaning *not*).
